
Council and various boards exemplifies his steadfast dedication to community enrichment and civic engagement.

Keynote Speaker Dale Hansen



Dale Hansen is a renowned American sportscaster, known for his impactful reporting and advocacy for social justice. He served as the weeknight sports anchor on ABC's Dallas affiliate WFAA for almost four decades, leaving an indelible mark on sports journalism. Hansen's fearless reporting and insightful commentaries have earned him numerous awards, including the prestigious Peabody Award and the Radio Television Digital News Association's Lifetime Achievement Award.

Hansen began his legendary career at WFAA on March 28, 1983, and just a few months later, the station debuted "Dale Hansen's Sports Special," a show that has been a staple of WFAA's Sunday night lineup ever since. While reporting on Dallas-Fort Worth sports, he covered the local teams in three Super Bowls, three Stanley Cup Finals, two World Series, and two NBA Finals.

Apart from his on-air accomplishments, Hansen was the first local broadcaster to receive the Radio Television Digital News Foundation's Lifetime Achievement Award, which he was honored with in 2019.

Hansen's career started as a radio disc jockey and operations manager in Newton, Iowa, before transitioning into sports reporting at KMTV in Omaha, Nebraska. His tenure at WFAA saw the hosting of "Dale Hansen's Sports Special," a highly-rated program in the Dallas-Fort Worth area that consistently captured an audience of over 300,000 viewers.

Beyond his journalistic endeavors, Hansen is committed to philanthropic work, aligning with his values of social responsibility. His advocacy for social justice has gained international recognition, sparking vital conversations and emphasizing the importance of standing up against inequality.

Hansen's accolades include multiple Sportscaster of the Year awards and the Communicator of the Year honor from the National Speech and Debate Association. Dale Hansen's impact extends beyond sports broadcasting, serving as a beacon of truth, integrity, and social consciousness. His fearless advocacy and dedication to justice inspire and provoke change in communities worldwide.


